| Course enrollment procedure | After completing the registration at MCU, students can enroll, change, add or drop personal course selection on-line through Student System during the online course add/drop period in the beginning of new semester. | Course load per semester | Most courses worth 2~3 credits, i.e. 2~3 classroom hours per week. A full-time student at MCU is strongly recommended to enroll in 9 credits at minimum and 25 credits at maximum per semester.
